2022-2023 Kids Read Now IMPACT REPORT

What a year!

Our formula is simple: Deliver books that have been self-selected by kids to turn them into reading evangelists.

This year, Kids Read Now helped 133,557 PK-5th students strengthen their reading success. These students were identified in partnership with 250 school districts across the country. Our organization delivered almost 1 million books this year! Over the last decade we have served over 468,000 students in 34 states. Kids Read Now works for all students, regardless of socio-economic background, gender, or race.

Our collective efforts are having an impact on the students we serve. Research shows that for every book read over the summer, students gain 6 days of learning. And for students who participate in Kids Read Now over the summer, student reading scores go up by three months, setting the stage for success for their upcoming school year.



Organizational Highlights

- Expanding our advocacy work at state legislative levels to bring awareness of Kids Read Now programs that are 98% as effective as summer schools for 3% of the cost. This work is currently underway in six states through the legislative process.
- Held our inaugural National Family Reading Day, May 23,
 2023 encouraging families to read together.
- Kids Read Now Received the Library of Congress Literacy Award for successful practices in literature in fall of 2022.
- Awarded a \$5M statewide contract from Utah to serve 73,000 K-3 students over the next 5 years.
- Growing private philanthropy through corporate, foundation and individual giving to help grow programs in schools and communities that struggle for funding. Thank you to those businesses, foundations and individuals who have given your support of treasure, time and talent.


